

IRI writes to PM for speedy probe into Koda case

Lucknow: Members of India Rejuvenation Initiative (IRI) have appealed to prime minister Manmohan Singh to ensure speedy and free-flowing investigations into the corruption case against former Jharkhand chief minister Madhu Koda and his associates and sought some more similar initiatives against other corrupt bureaucrats and politicians to ensure that the faith of the majority remains intact in the democracy that India is.

In the two-paged letter sent to the prime minister a few days ago, the IRI has pinned its hope on Manmohan Singh to ensure proper investigation of corruption charges against the former Jharkhand CM, seeking help to ensure that the officials involved in investigations of this particular case and other similar cases, were provided full protection in order to ensure that they deliver with full honesty.
